

- Started with the killing of Michael Brown, Jr. in Ferguson, MO in 2014
- Personal soul-searching
- Learning terms like redlining, restrictive deed covenants, and *Shelley v. Kramer.*



HOW ARE ST. LOUIS CITY AND ST. LOUIS COUNTY DIFFERENT?

- Different taxing and school districts
- Unequal allocation of resources
 - Philanthropic funding is higher in St. Louis City
 - Funding projects have traditionally favored west and/or south St. Louis County
 - North St. Louis County is underserved and underresourced
- North St. Louis County is predominantly Black/African-American

HEALTHY FOOD ACCESS & SEGREGATION

- St. Louis is the 6th most segregated city in Americadivided by the Delmar divide
- North of Delmar divide- 99% Black, South of Delmar- 70% white
- \$25,000 difference between average incomes
- Residential segregation is also food access segregation
 - The orange on the map indicates a food desert





Figure 2: Neighborhoods divided by Delmar Blvd. in St. Louis City



The figures above represent median home values, and median household income Source: American Community Survey 2007–2011 5 year estimates







- St. Louis Food Policy Coalition supports our efforts.




